In addition, Chris is the Associate Dean for Taught Programmes within the School of Life and Health Sciences at Aston University.

Chris' professional background is in hospital pharmacy, but he has worked as an academic pharmacist since the completion of his PhD in 2000. His undergraduate and postgraduate teaching focusses on the legal and ethical components of pharmacy, along with a range of aspects relating to professional pharmacy practice.

Chris' national work includes membership of the GPhC's Accreditation and Recognition Panel as both a team leader and team member, acting as a registrant member of the GPhC's statutory Fitness to Practise Committee, and membership of the GPhC Board of Assessors.

Chris is a General Pharmaceutical Council (GPhC) registrant, a Fellow of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society, a Member of the Royal Society of Chemistry, Fellow of the Royal Society of Biology and a Principal Fellow of the Higher Education Academy. In 2012, Chris completed his Master of Laws (LLM) degree in the Legal Aspects of Medical Practice from Cardiff University.

Chris' research interests include examining the role of the pharmacist in both primary and secondary care, alongside research work within the area of pharmacy education and policy. He has published numerous academic papers and professional reports, and he is also the co-author of five academic textbooks.
