



## Dr Geoff Hall

*Retired, formerly Associate Head of the the Leicester School of Pharmacy, De Montfort University*

After graduating from the University of Strathclyde in 1977 with a BSc in Pharmacy (Special Chemistry) Geoff undertook pre-registration training with Tayside Health Board before returning to the University of Strathclyde in 1978 to study for a PhD in pharmaceutical chemistry. On completion of his PhD in 1981 he joined the Leicester School of Pharmacy, then part of Leicester Polytechnic, as a lecturer in pharmaceutical chemistry.

Geoff taught pharmaceutical chemistry to most years of the Pharmacy degree at Leicester and took a particular interest in integrating pharmaceutical chemistry into modules based on body systems. He undertook most roles associated with the teaching and running of a Pharmacy degree and was programme leader for the BSc Pharmaceutical and Cosmetic Science before becoming Associate Head of School. He retired from De Montfort University in 2016. Geoff has experience of external examining at a number of schools of pharmacy and was involved, both internally and externally, in validation and periodic review for a variety of degrees.

As well as being a pharmacist Geoff is a member of the Royal Society of Chemistry and is a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy. Geoff has also been actively involved in secondary education, serving as a school governor for over 20 years, including being chair of governors for a 10 to 14 high school and subsequently chair of trustees for an 11-19 academy trust.
