Leonie Milliner is the Chief Executive of the Association for Nutrition (AfN). Appointed in April 2011, she is responsible for leading the AfN's staff team; advising AfN President and Council on business strategy, governance and policy development with the aim of demonstrating the benefits of a well-regulated evidence-based profession. In October 2016 Leonie was appointed to the government's Office for Student's Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) main panel, and to the 2017-19 TEF subject pilot panel for Medicine and Health Sciences. She also served on the 2016 QAA review for the Subject Benchmark Statement for Agriculture, Horticulture, Forestry, Food, Nutrition and Consumer Sciences.

In addition, Leonie has served on boards and committees of various charities and public bodies, including HEFCE's Widening Participation Committee (2004-2005), CITB Lifelong Learning Committee, (2000-2005), as a non-executive director of RIBA Enterprises Ltd, (1996-2002) partner member of the Nursing and Midwifery Council Professional Practice & Registration Committee, (2009-11) and was Chair of Trustees, RIBA Education Fund.

An architect by training, Leonie worked in private practice in London designing social and private housing before being appointed in 1998 as Director of Education at the Royal Institute of British Architects, (RIBA), promoted in 2004 to head up RIBA Professional Services Ltd.
