It was stressed that the SOP activities assist in the development of relevant knowledge. In terms of knowledge, the designated supervisor signs-off on relevant SOPs. The Core activity packs include role play scenarios that show trainees how to adapt communication styles to different situations. The designated supervisor makes a final declaration based on a final check to ensure that the trainee has demonstrated that they have achieved the NOS outcome throughout the programme.
