Tania graduated from the University of Wales, College of Cardiff with a BSc (Hons) in Biochemistry in 1989. She obtained her PhD in Molecular Neurobiology from the University of Cambridge in 1994, undertaking her doctoral research at the MRC Centre at Addenbrookes Hospital. Tania then moved to the Royal Free Hospital School of Medicine where her post-doctoral research on purinergic receptors was funded by Astra Zeneca and the Wellcome Trust. In 2000 Tania joined De Montfort University as a Senior Lecturer where she led a BBSRC funded research group that focused on functional properties of P2Y receptors. She joined the Leicester School of Pharmacy in 2003, was promoted to Principal Lecturer in 2005 and to Associate Professor in 2018. During this time (2009 -2016) Tania was the MPharm programme leader. As a member of the School Leadership Team, Tania's focus is on embedding innovative learning, teaching and assessment activities across the School's undergraduate and postgraduate provision. She also chairs the School Learning and Teaching Group and the MPharm Programme Management Board.

She contributes to both undergraduate and postgraduate teaching at the Leicester School of Pharmacy in the areas of therapeutics and genomics, leading modules on personalised healthcare and bioinformatics. With extensive experience of course development, quality assurance and research supervision, Tania has been an external advisor, panel member and external examiner for other HEIs.

Tania's current research interests are pedagogic and focus on active learning and effective feedback.
